

Planning for Emergencies in NSW

Emergencies can happen unexpectedly, from bushfires to floods and power outages. For all of us, including older adults, being prepared is essential to staying safe and minimizing stress during a crisis.

Tips

- Create a personal emergency plan.
- Identify hazards in your home and building. Know and practice an evacuation route.
- Share your plan with family, friends and or your Support Worker.
- Prepare an emergency kit with essentials such as medications, important cards, documents, water, non-perishable food, a flashlight, and a first aid kit. Don't forget glasses, hearing aids, spare batteries and a warm blanket.
- Ensure your phone is always fully charged.
- Consider buying a small battery-operated radio.
- Complete emergency contact, see page 8. Keep it handy!

Recipe Corner

Crunchy Summer Lettuce Parcels

An easy and flexible recipe. We suggest canned tuna however, you can also add leftover cooked chicken of beef instead.



Ingredients (makes 2-3 depending on size of lettuce leaves)

2-3 crunchy, fresh lettuce leaves (Wash/dry gently with paper towel)

- 250g can of tuna in spring water
- 1 large fresh tomato (chopped)
- 1/2 cup defrosted frozen or canned corn
- 3 teaspoons of your favourite premade salad dressing

Optional: Add chopped nuts and other veggies e.g. fresh capsicum, cucumber.

Method

- Arrange your lettuce leaves like little boats on a large plate.
- Open the can of tuna. Drain away any water. Place tuna in a bowl.
- Mix in chopped tomato, corn and other veggies and nuts. Add the dressing and mix gently.
- Divide the mixture between the lettuce parcels.
- Enjoy immediately.
